Review Papers provide a valuable contribution to the literature because these present a critical analysis of the literature in the field of interest at that moment in time. These are more than a simple chronological telling of progress, or a tutorial of the review subject. Therefore, *Review* **Papers** require the author(s) to have significant expertise in the subject of the paper as evidenced by prior peer-reviewed publications. A critical analysis of the subject literature requires the authors to review many papers in the field, to underscore the state of the art, and to point out new challenges in the field. When there are related review articles in publication, the authors should reference those prior reviews and then analyze the developments and new advances since the publication of earlier reviews. As an expert in the field the author is in a unique position to understand the literature in his or her field of study and to be able to *critically* assess that subject. In this manner the reader benefits from the review with a timely, expert analysis of the subject literature.

The Chemistry Journal of Moldova encourages *Review Papers* on topics:

- 2. Ecological chemistry
- 3. Food chemistry
- 4. Industrial chemistry
- 5. Inorganic and coordination chemistry
- 6. Natural product chemistry and synthesis

Contributions should comprise an even number of pages. Maximum allowed length of the *Review* **Paper** – 20 pages, with no more than 100 references. Authors are also kindly requested to adhere to the formatting instructions for font size and layout.

Cover letter

Please prepare a cover letter to the Editor-in-Chief containing the following information:

- 1. Justification why the manuscript should be published in "Chemistry Journal of Moldova. General, Industrial and Ecological Chemistry";
- 2. Declaration that the manuscript has not been published previously, in English or in any other language;
- 3. Declaration that the manuscript is not under consideration for publication in any other scientific journals;
- 4. The research field of their manuscript as well as the nature of contribution (Short Communication, Research Paper or Review Article);
- 5. A rationale for a review at this time included in cover letter;
- 6. Names, complete affiliations (spelled out), country and contact details (including current and valid (preferably business) e-mail address) of **5 potential reviewers**. Suggested reviewers should not be from the same department or division as one of the authors (the same university, state, country should also be avoided); and should not be the persons with whom authors have collaborated within the past three years. *Field of expertise* and at least *three publications* relevant to the scientific field of the submitted manuscript must be provided for each of the suggested reviewers
 - **Note**: The Editor retains the sole right to decide whether or not the suggested reviewers are used.
- 7. Names, the scientific title and degree, complete affiliations (spelled out), country and contact details (including current and valid (preferably business) e-mail address) of the authors should be included at the end of the cover letter. The cover letter should be signed by the corresponding author, indicating under his name the scientific title and degree, followed be affiliation.
